Marine Mammals of Maine presents: "A Seal's Journey"

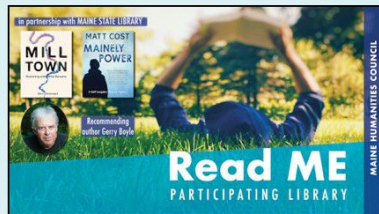


Thursday, July 1 at 10 a.m.

Lithgow Library to Participate in Read ME



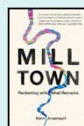
Join Lithgow Library in participating in Read ME, a statewide summer reading experience for adults.

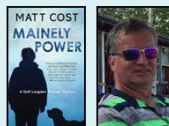

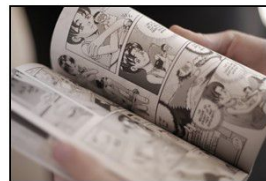

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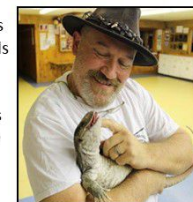
