Same-Day Browsing Appointments Update

We've heard you and have
expanded our times for same-day
browsing by appointment!



Starting November 2nd, half hour slots will be
available Monday-Thursday 10-7, Friday 10-4,
and on Saturday from 9-11.

Browse the latest new materials on the 1st floor
landing (fiction, non-fiction, large print, dvds, audio
books and graphic works), as well as the general
DVD and audiobook collections in the Historic
Wing, and our popular paperback collection.

All are available by same-day appointment. Call
the library at 626-2415 to make an appointment or
for questions. If space is available, we will accept
walk-in appointments. Lithgow-To-Go will still be
offered, and other areas of our collection will be
available at a future date.

Starting November 2nd: Browsing by Appointment in the Children's Area



Families can book 30-minute appointments to browse
and check out books from our collection.
Appointments can be scheduled by phone the day
you wish to browse.

To limit the spread of coronavirus, we ask:

- * families arrive promptly for their appointment
- * only members of one household per visit
- * everyone over the age of two wear masks over their mouth and nose during the duration of the visit (kid and adult masks are available)
- * children under the age of two are carried or in a carrier/stroller
- * all patrons sanitize hands or wear gloves before browsing
- * parents/caregivers closely monitor children's movements while in the library--children may not be left unattended at any time
- * no food or drink, and personal items (such as children's backpacks and toys) left at home

Please also note that there are no toys, games, or
children's computers available during these
appointments.

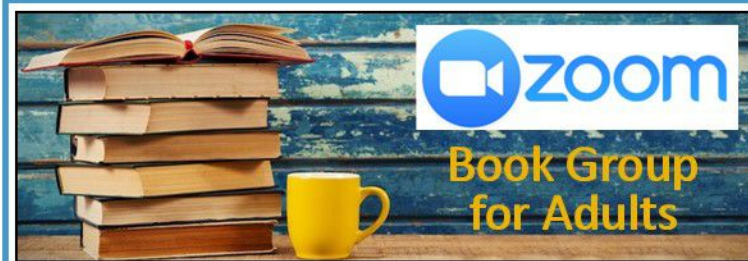
Tween Zoom Scene

"So You Think You Know Maine"

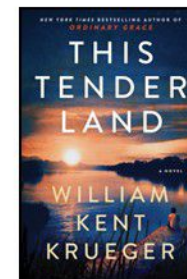
