"Every Two Minutes:

Why Pregnant People Die and How To Change It"

Presented by Dr. Julia McDonald

Dr. McDonald will discuss the global crisis for women through the lens of her sexual and reproductive health work in central and eastern Africa, Latin America, and North America.

She started volunteering for **Doctors Without Borders** in 2020, and with them has worked in Ethiopia, DRC, Kenya, and CAR. In 2019, she was awarded the State's "Physician of the Year" by the Maine Academy of Family Physicians, and the Maine Medical Association honored her with the *Cushman Award for Exceptional Humanitarian Service* earlier this year.

Indian Immigration

Presented by Jennifer Atkinson Tuesday, January 23rd at 6:30 p.m.

Indian nationals represent the second largest U.S. immigrant group today, comprising 6 percent of the foreign-born population. While settlement patterns do not highlight Maine as a hot spot for Indian nationals, signs of growth are evident. Jennifer Atkinson will describe how Indian migration to the U.S. is shaped by federal immigration law, highlight resulting population patterns and trends, and discuss this growth from a Maine perspective.

Jennifer Atkinson is one of a handful of Maine lawyers practicing immigration north of Portland. As an attorney at Gallagher, Villeneuve and DeGeer, PLLC in Damariscotta, Jennifer's immigration practice concentrates on family-based, citizenship, and humanitarian matters.


